CICTE 2019 will be held at the MINOA PALACE RESORT & SPA in Crete, the very successful venue where ICICTE 2013 and 2018 were held. This is a luxury 5* beach side hotel. The hotel offers majestic views of its surrounding countryside and the White Mountains. To the north, the hotel enjoys panoramic views of the endless golden beach of Platanias with the shimmering sapphire blue Aegean beyond.
